Proposal Review Criteria

- I. QUALITY AND TECHNICAL MERIT
 - a. Does the proposal demonstrate an awareness of the state of current research?
 - b. Does the proposal describe a sound methodology, analytic or technical approach?
 - c. How feasible is the proposed project?
 - d. Does the proposal suggest an innovation and creative approach to address a problem?
- II. IMPACT OF THE PROJECT
 - a. Does the proposed work hold potential for the advancement of science?
 - b. Is the proposed work relevant to policy and practice?
 - c. Is this project likely to attract additional sponsored activities?
- III. CAPABILITIES, DEMONSTRATED PRODUCTIVITY, AND EXPERIENCE OF **APPLICANTS**
 - a. Does the PI demonstrate the ability to complete the proposed effort?
 - b. Does the applicant demonstrate a record of successful past performance?
- **IV. BUDGET CONSIDERATION**
 - a. Is the FIF an appropriate mechanism to advance this work?
 - b. Are the budgeted project costs appropriate for the level of effort?

Impact/Priority Descriptor Additional Guidance on Strengths/Weaknesses Impact Score 1 Exceptional Exceptionally strong with essentially no weaknesses High 2 Outstanding Extremely strong with negligible weaknesses 3 Very strong with only some minor weaknesses Excellent 4 Very Good Strong but with numerous minor weaknesses Moderate 5 Good Strong but with at least one moderate weakness Some strengths but also some moderate 6 Satisfactory weaknesses Some strengths but with at least one major 7 Fair weakness Low 8 Marginal A few strengths and a few major weaknesses Very few strengths and numerous major 9 Poor weaknesses Definitions: Minor: easily addressable weakness that does not substantially lessen the impact of the project. **Moderate:** weakness that lessens the impact of the project. **Major:** weakness that severely limits the impact of the project.
