A Values-Based Approach to Grant Writing Workshop

What you'll learn:

- The 'art' of grant writing, especially for federal mechanisms, often focuses on the procedural steps to take, e.g. investigate what other types of research in your area have been funded and by whom; review successful proposals from colleagues; reach out early to the program officer; establish a timeline and 'daily writing practice.'
- While important, the procedural knowledge does not address the relationship of you (the researcher) to your scholarship or your values in research.
- Learn an alternative approach to thinking about grant writing; as a process of identifying and grounding in your own authentic relationship with your work, your values, and your future vision.
- Writing research grants from a values-based perspective builds confidence and motivation for the writing process.
