> WHAT IS POLITICAL SCIENCE?

Political Science is a social science concerned with the description and analysis of political institutions and processes. Increasingly, the emphasis is being placed on how governments deal with specific policy problems, such as war and peace, poverty, crime, education, energy, pollution, or inter-group relations, and on the factors that affect these problems. The study of political science provides students with the concepts, theories, and methods necessary to analyze these policy problems scientifically.

COMMON JOB TYPES

- Legislative Aide Draft and edit legislation, also help to create legislation, speeches, or letters to introduce to committees or other legislators.
- **Operations Research Analyst** Formulate and apply mathematical methods to develop and interpret information that assists management with decision and policy making, Collect and analyze information to determine optimal time, cost, or logistics for program evaluation, review, or implementation.
- **Paralegal** Assist lawyers by investigating information in regards to various cases, prepare legal documents, and research legal precedent. May also conduct research to support a legal proceeding, strengthen a defense, or to initiate legal action.
- Economic Analyst Address economic problems by preparing reports, formulating plans, and/or conducting research related to monetary and fiscal policy or the distribution of goods and services.
- **News Producer** Coordinate various aspects of a news studio like production, script selection, writing, directing, and editing.
