

Some sample questions to think about when deciding your internship program:



Sample questions to think about when deciding your internship program:

- What <u>skills</u> do I want to develop? (e.g. professional, language)
- What <u>careers</u> or <u>industries</u> would I like exposure to?
- What types of internship placements are <u>available</u>?
- Which <u>city</u> or <u>country</u> do I want to experience?
- How long is the program? How many hours do I work, versus study?
- How many <u>credits</u> will I earn?
- Will the number of credits <u>affect my financial aid</u> package?
- Do I need to fulfill <u>degree</u> <u>requirements</u>?
- What is included in the program fee? How much is the total cost?



Placement Process



Apply through MSU

Office for Education Abroad Website

Pre-acceptance meeting/interview with college coordinator

Acceptance into program

Nomination from MSU to on-site partners (CEA CAPA, Connect123, CRCC)

Student submits resume & materials to on-site partners.

Placement Interview

Discuss professional goals, skills, experiences; Define your three areas of interest

Consider priorities and type of experience desired

On-site partners work with variety of industries and types of companies/orgs.
Trust their expertise and recommendations!

Supervisor Interview

Via Phone or Zoom (typically Zoom)

Provisional Placements are emailed to students (up to a week before arrival). Research company or organization! Think of questions to ask!

On Site Confirmation
Interviews happen at some sites
during orientation week.

On going support, mid-point check in, final evaluation
